Key Responsibilities

- Encouraging the participation in leadership roles and activities by Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander students, and
- Leading in the promotion of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people's culture.
- Write the House report for the College Magazine.
- Lead College assemblies, Masses and events, as per the College calendar.
- Always demonstrate qualities of good sportsmanship, and in all competitions.
- Meet regularly with other College leaders, to discuss action plans and coordinate activities.

Initiatives may include:

- Leading activities in the promotion of NAIDOC Week
- Being involved in the 'Beyond Broncos' program to provide support and encouragement to our indigenous students through improving student attendance and Year 12 attainment rates.
- Hosting Reconciliation week breakfast and activities throughout the week including opportunities where student may create artworks &/or stories inspired by a theme to reflect on what reconciliation means to them and focus on building relationships and understanding.
- Holding a NAIDOC week dinner, including the invitation of special guests and/or a guest speaker.
- 'Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Peoples' student of the week, acknowledging a particular achievement or contribution to their school community.
- Creating a roster for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander students to recite the Welcome to Country for all College events.
